A Birth Tissue Donation Story.

Our birth tissue donation program first started in January 2021 — and the spark to its beginning is a personal one.

A few years ago, a family member of our team experienced a traumatic injury to his eye. For months he struggled with complications before receiving an amnion graft, which uses placenta tissue (or birth tissue), to aid in the healing of his cornea. That amnion graft, in combination with corrective surgery, led to a night-and-day difference in his sight. For us, that outcome was all the proof we needed to know that birth tissue donation was a worthwhile mission.

A Special Way to Heal.

Birth tissue has the ability to become the support structure for new cell growth, anywhere in or on the body. Its adaptable nature enables its use in a wide range of patient treatments, including healing burns or skin infections, protecting nerves during surgery, treating dry eye, and more. This means our donors have the opportunity to help so many more people — expanding our organization's impact.

How the Donation Process Works.

Most of our partner hospitals have on-site coordinators. These coordinators meet with mothers who have just arrived to the hospital to have their baby to present the option of participating in our Birth Tissue Donation Program. If a mother consents, the paperwork and medical questionnaire takes no more than 20 minutes. After that, the birth tissue is collected without disruption to their birthing or post-birth.



A Mother's Blessing.

As a team member of Sanford Health, Caitlin Swartz has known about birth tissue donation and its benefits for several years. Countless times she has witnessed the use of birth tissue to better the healing outcomes for many surgical patients. Unsurprisingly, Caitlin had zero hesitation saying "yes" to birth tissue donation on the day her daughter was born.

"The birth of your baby can help so many others. So, if you don't plan on keeping your placenta for any reason, consider donation. It's an easy process. All I needed to do was answer a few medical questions, fill out and sign a couple forms, and that was it. Now my baby is a hero with the onesie to prove it."
